Today's implantology - what is new, what is reliable?

17th European Symposium of BDIZ EDI in Split/Croatia

Today's implantology – what is new, what is reliable? With this assessment of the current situation in oral implantology, the BDIZ EDI describes its 17th European Symposium on 10 and 11 May 2024 in Split/Croatia.

"In view of the fact that we are already at a very high level with high success rates in implant therapy, it is anything but easy to decide whether "new" really means "better". Nature has set limits to our pursuit of ever better results and shorter treatment times," says BDIZ EDI President Christian Berger. This makes it all the more important for implantologists to continue their education to stay abreast of the latest scientific and technical innovations and materials for the benefit of their patients and their practices. Education and training must keep pace with developments.

The BDIZ EDI has therefore always considered the exchange of ideas as part of its professional focus. It is organising its European Symposium for the 17th time, and for the fourth time in Croatia.

The program with internationally renowned speakers consists of a workshop on Friday afternoon and the all-day symposium in English on Saturday at the Ambasador hotel in the port of Split. Demosthenes (384 to 322 BC) already knew that "the starting point for the greatest undertakings often lies in barely perceptible opportunities". This quotation is characteristic of the European Symposia of the BDIZ EDI. Humble beginnings and spurious opportunities have been consolidated into a comprehensive approach that allows communities of dentists to transcend national borders and to intensify the exchange of ideas within Europe. Christian Berger: "The 17th European Symposium in Croatia is the best example of this. It will once again demonstrate how implant dentists from all over Europe can benefit from each other's experience."

Saturday, May 11, 2024, 9.15 a.m. to 5 p.m.: Symposium followed by a get-together. Themes are AI in medicine and dentistry, digitally assisted surgery, bone transplantation in dental implantology, immediate implants in the frontal region, digital augmentation procedures.
